

Richmond Association of Black Social Workers 2024 RABSW Scholarship

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. The Richmond Chapter ABSW Scholarship is only available to those applicants referred by a financially active Richmond Chapter Member.
- 2. Applicants must be either a graduating High School Senior, who has been accepted to a two-year or four- year College or University as a full-time student, or a full-time student currently enrolled at a two-year or four-year College or University
- 3. Applicants must have maintained a grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5. (*Exceptions may be made for applicants who have made significant progress and who have a high level of motivation*).
- 4. Richmond Chapter of ABSW will award scholarships up to \$1,500.00. If needed, the committee will determine the scholarship amount awarded to recipients.
- 5. The Richmond Chapter ABSW Scholarship is based on merit, and not on financial need.
- 6. Applicants must complete an application and all information requested must accompany the application, at the time of submission, in order to be considered. **Application must be typed.**
- 7. Applicants majoring in social work or a related field are encouraged to apply.
